Pastoral Reflection

As we turn the page into a new year together, heartfelt wishes go out to everyone for health, joy, and blessing in the months ahead. There is something hopeful about a calendar changing. It reminds us that life keeps moving forward under God's care. Even when nothing feels especially new, the simple gift of another year invites trust again in God's mercy, His patience, and His steadfast presence among us.

The parishioners and friends of St. Mary's continue to give so much of themselves. Time, talent, and treasure are offered generously, often without notice or recognition. Thank you all so very much. Scripture tells us that God loves a cheerful giver, and that spirit is alive and well here. Please continue to pray for the church, for its staff, and for all of its ministries. Parish life is not carried by a few but shared by many. It is something we hold together, and it is strengthened by every person who calls St. Mary's home.

This time of year usually comes with talk of goals and resolutions, but the Orthodox Church gently points us in a different direction. Once again, thank you. Thank you for your faithfulness, generosity, patience, and love. May the coming year be filled with peace, perseverance, and the joy that is found in Christ, as we continue forward together into the new year.

Safety and Security Update

The Safety and Security Committee recently learned about a grant opportunity that could provide funding to enhance safety and security across St. Mary's properties. Applications will be submitted in the spring, with grant awards announced in the fall.

One of our initial projects is the installation of security cameras. If approved, this grant would help fund this effort along with other improvements.

As a first step, a professional security assessment will be completed. We are fortunate to have a security consulting firm offering this service at no cost. Our goal is to complete the assessment before the end of the year so the results can support our grant application.

We will continue to keep the parish updated on our progress.

Choir Notes

Serbian Saints Who (probably) Sing By Julie Moricz

Happy New Year - not liturgically, but at least civilly and for tax purposes. As I reflect back on the previous calendar year, one of the highlights was my trip to Serbia and the many monasteries and churches we visited. Prior to the trip, I was most excited to visit Žiča, which we in the US equate with St. Nikolai Velimirović, but I learned that Žiča is just the head of the Diocese in the western part of Serbia, and the real place to visit was Lelić. It was here at Lelić where we venerated the relics of St. Nikolai and experienced a glimpse of his life. Žiča was beautiful, and large, with numerous chapels and buildings, but it was also very rainy and cold, so our group didn't spend much time at this monastery. Now this series of articles is not designed to be a history lesson, but I have been thinking about various saints, who while not recognized as hymnographers, no doubt sang during their lives.

St. Nikolai was a Bishop, but before that, he was a monk. And I know a little bit about monastic life, and I can assure you there is A LOT of church and attending services involved in being a monk. Was St. Nikolai assigned to sing? Did he chant the Epistle? Did he read the Hours? We may never know those answers, but he was definitely immersed in the liturgical life of the church, no doubt praying and participating in services several times each day.

Nikolai, considered the Serbian Chrysostom for his writings and eloquent sermons, was born in Lelić on January 4, 1881. He was the firstborn in a family of eight children. His parents were farmers, and Nikolai often accompanied his mother walking to the local monastery, the Ćelije Monastery in Western Serbia. Lelić is a small village about 5-miles southwest of Valjevo (to you the readers, Valjevo means nothing, but to me it was the place where we had the best beer in Serbia – so if you travel there, do not miss an opportunity to enjoy a delicious Tchanin Pivo).

St. Nikolai entered St. Sava Seminary in Belgrade, but also studied at the University of Berne, Kings College in Oxford, and St. Petersburg Theological Academy. Fluent in seven languages, Nikolai returned to Belgrade and taught philosophy, logic, and other subjects at the Seminary in Belgrade. I saw the building where he taught – I walked those same city streets where Nikolai himself walked. I wonder if he ever sang while he walked . . . sometimes I kind of hum.

At the start of World War I, Nikolai was sent to England, and from England, he came to America. But soon after his arrival in the US, he returned to Serbia, where he was consecrated Bishop of Žiča and one year later became Bishop of Ohrid. In 1921, while serving in Ohrid, Nikolai again returned to the US

and lectured at numerous churches and universities during his visit. When World War II broke out, Nikolai and numerous others were sent to Dachau concentration camp. Through the mercy of God, Nikolai was spared and returned to the US for the final time in 1946 following the end of the war.

Initially St. Nikolai taught at the Serbian Seminary in Libertyville, IL, but then moved to St. Tikhon's Monastery and Seminary where he served as Dean and Rector, while also lecturing at St. Vladimir's Seminary and Holy Trinity Monastery.

All of these places, all of these services, surely he sang. As a monk he kept a prayer rule, as a priest and bishop he intoned numerous litanies, presided at numerous liturgical services . . . surely he sang!

A prolific speaker and writer, St. Nikolai is probably best known for *The Life of St. Sava* (published by St. Vladimir's Seminary Press), *Prayers by the Lake*, *The Faith of the Saints* (an Orthodox Catechism), and the *Prologue of Ohrid*.

St. Nikolai fell asleep in the Lord on March 18, 1956 at St. Tikhon's. He was initially buried in Libertyville, IL, but honoring his desire to return to Serbia, in 1991 St. Nikolai's relics were transferred to his childhood home and the Ćelije Monastery in Lelić. It is here, at this beautiful monastery, where we were able to venerate the relics of this amazing Saint who touched the lives of many throughout the world, and I'm sure could sing.

Open Choir Sundays

Theophany House Blessings

It is the custom of many Orthodox Christians to have their homes blessed during the Theophany season with water blessed at the special festal services. When the parish priest comes to bless a home, he uses an ancient prayer of the Church asking the Lord, "to keep safe from all harm those who dwell here, bestowing on them Thy blessing, purification, and bodily health, and granting all their petitions which are for their salvation and eternal life."

We prepare an appropriate place in our homes for the very short service to be sung: a table should be prepared with a clean white cloth, a bowl with holy water, and an icon or a cross. The priest himself will have holy water, and an icon with him, in case they are needed. A list of the baptismal names of everyone in the family is useful because we sing Many Years at the end of the House Blessing. Televisions and radios ought to be turned off, of course. A member of the family may carry the bowl of holy water and lead the priest through the house as we bless and sing.

At one time, the parish priest would come to every house in the parish as a matter of course, and the days following Theophany would see a veritable parade up and down streets in the neighborhood. It was a festive time and a time for visiting. Times and circumstances have changed. Yet, houses are still blessed, only now upon specific request. You can make such a request by filling out the form below and submitting it to the parish office. At the very least people should collect Holy Water at church, bring a jar or some sort of container to use prayerfully at home.
