Choir Notes

How beloveds, can we accustom ourselves to fasting? First of all, it requires gradual acclimation. Some rashly and hastily jump in and start fasting beyond their strength. Such a fast is not tenable, not useful, but rather harmful. They either harm their health or become impatient and irritable from hunger – they get mad at everyone and everything to no avail, or their fasting soon becomes unbearable and they give it up. To make our disposition towards fasting firm, we have to accustom ourselves to fasting slowly, carefully... gradually – little by little.

At the start of the year, I had the privilege of attending our Winter Camp program. Over fifteen years had passed since I was last there as a counselor, and I found that between the local colloquialisms, the songs by One Direction, and suddenly being the oldest person aside from the clergyman, my return was, low-key, more challenging than expected. Still, perseverance won the day, and despite the frigid weather, our hearts and spirits remained warm.

The theme at camp this year was building intimate relationships. There were four education sessions, the first three focusing on how to build an intimate relationship with the people around us. Intimacy was defined as a deep connection between people that is built over time with the foundations of trust, empathy, patience, Christ-like love, and many others. Building a strong intimate relationship takes work from both parties, but the budding-adults all agreed the work was worthwhile, giving examples of good feelings that are a result of this work, laughter, and stability in oneself being the beginning. There was a lot more covered on the topic, more than even I, succinct writer that I am, cannot sum up on one page.

At the end, we took all that we had learned and applied it to building an intimate relationship with God. Although this last lesson was assigned to yours truly, fewer people than usual fell asleep, and the adults (budding ones included) were drawn along on a journey. We talked about how the sea of life, surging with the storm of temptations, is everywhere, palpably manifesting as anxiety, stress, anger, etc. We talked about the Calm Haven that, despite the raging winds and tempest, is always there in the midst of it all. Like the whisper in the wind after the earthquake and the fire and the breaking mountains, it is always there. We talked about how to find this Calm Haven within ourselves, and how, from that calm haven, crying out with our hearts to God, we can go even deeper into the realm of spiritual peace. We were reminded of Apostle Peter walking on the water in the middle of a storm, and how the moment he turned away from Jesus, he was pulled down into the waves. But as we know, that was not the end. Peter turned back to Jesus and cried out, and Jesus heard him and pulled him up out of the sea.

I was given the above quote shortly before I went to winter camp by someone who clearly knows how bad I am at fasting. The, perhaps not so subtle, theme of little by little really resonated with me during camp. I was reminded once again of how subtle God is. How He puts these little themes in our lives, and if we pay attention, we can notice them and hopefully learn from them. May God grant us all constant opportunities to grow in our relationship with Him, little by little. May we all find our way to that calm haven where the sea of life can do us no harm. May we find the quiet stillness that is everywhere present, filling all things.

May God grant us all a fruitful Lenten journey. Blessed Lent.

Saints Friday Night Lenten Dinners

Friday night Lenten Dinners are returning! Please join us for food and fellowship on Fridays: February 27, March 6, March 13, March 20, March 27, & April 3. Dinners will be served immediately following Pre-Sanctified Liturgy. There will be a speaker each week.

Dinner includes our famous salad bar each week plus a surprise entree (soup, veggie chili, pasta...), bread, and dessert. All prepared by the St. Mary's Saints Youth Group and various adult volunteers. Cost \$10 Adults, \$5 youth, free for those under five years old. There is a price cap of \$30 for a family. If you just want dessert and a beverage \$3 for Adults and \$1 for Kids.

We had great success last year with hosts willing to prepare the main Lenten entree for each week's meal. We also graciously accept help with set-up, serving, clean-up, and donated desserts. Youth who help at the dinners will be able to earn community service hours for any organizations they are members of. All proceeds from the dinners will benefit our Saints youth program. Capital Campaigns & Kitchen Donation Update

The following is a happy update regarding capital campaigns and the official closing-in-a-good-way of the Kitchen Renovation Project. For bigger context, moving into 2026, St. Mary's is trying to have fewer capital campaign projects open: realistically, a capital campaign should be focused on just one project instead of split amongst three, four, or five competing projects. Having too many projects open can cause confusion when parishioners are deciding where to donate their money, and managing too many accounts can become burdensome, and not get us the best return on investment. We also want to avoid having too many "zombie" projects out there: projects that are in many ways done, yet not fully complete, and thus they linger on - never dying, but not fully alive (much like how members of those projects may feel).

All that being said, it is with happiness that we can, in fact, close the Kitchen Renovation as a capital campaign project. This does NOT mean that we will stop doing maintenance in the kitchen or

that we cannot buy needed items. It simply means that since all the big-ticket items and work associated with the Kitchen Renovation have been completed, it no longer needs to stay open as a capital campaign. Future purchases (e.g., new cutting boards or replacing a faucet) could come from the General Fund or Property Maintenance fund, for example. A HUGE thank you to all those who have contributed their money and time to helping this project cross the finish line!

What does this mean moving forward? Effective now, any donations via Venmo or ACH that are earmarked for "kitchen" will instead go to Parish Homes. And this will become standard practice in 2026: as we close out other capital campaigns, we will update the parish about where donations to a finished campaign will go to.

February 1 - Chili Lunch Fundraiser

The Women's Club is an active group within our parish that provides financial support for numerous parish needs as well as requests for other Orthodox social programs. Monies raised from the Chili Fundraiser will be used to support needs such as: repair, cleaning, and replacement of altar vestments; addressing needs for our summer church campers, meals, and necessities for FOCUS Minnesota, and other requests for support within the parish community.

Perohi Group History

After I attended my first church annual meeting and listened to how the church and Parish Center were in need of repair, I asked myself why we couldn't start a Perohi Group like the Ukrainians did (which paid for their church). Perohi Fundraising Group started in 1976 with Helen Kalina, V. Rev. Fr. John Matusiak, and Helen Josul.

Helen and I used our own funds for ingredients. Fr. John figured out our recipes. We offered five different fillings: potato and cheese, cabbage, kraut, prune, and cottage cheese. At that time we sold 6 perohi in a package for \$1.25. The first deposit from our Friday sale was \$75!! We sold 60 bags and laughed all the way to the bank. Helen and I didn't drive, so drivers helped us out in getting to the Parish Center. My husband, Nick, would work all night until 8 a.m. and then drive for us.

Fr. Lecko asked me to start a seniors' group and I pointed out that all the seniors were joining Perohi group! It was fun to see our seniors so happy. They started wearing pantsuits instead of house dresses. Pretty soon, they were getting permanents and wearing earrings. Many baked treats for coffee break. One lady always brought a fresh-baked loaf of bread she made. Men were starting to come and join us!

Today it is not unusual to see John Hlivka, Bill Varhol, and Mary Sue Skirka by 6 a.m. starting the fillings, and Gloria Tarasar peeling potatoes.

Thirty-five years strong and still working.


