Pastoral Reflection

Dear St. Mary's Faithful and Friends,

We are preparing for and anticipating the start of Lent on March 18. We begin to focus on Christ and our spiritual life more intently. Many of us will start this journey preparing to fast, pray, read more of scripture, brush up on some classic and traditional Lenten readings, and attend more services. There are so many things to do and our church offers up opportunities for us to take advantage of.

We will start with the right of forgiveness on the eve of March 17. This service sets the tone. It is important to help our hearts and minds be free of anger and resentments toward others before we start the spiritual climb toward Pascha. Each night of the first week we will do the canon of St Andrew of Crete. This service focuses on our sinfulness and our need for Christ. Each Friday evening we offer a worship service and then a Lenten discussion following in the dining room. Our youth group provides a Lenten meal for \$10.

On Sunday afternoons in Great Lent, our Pan Orthodox clergy association known as Minnesota Eastern Orthodox Christian Clergy Association (MEOCCA) will offer an afternoon service at a different Orthodox Church. For more info, please visit their website at www.meocca.org and look at their calendar of events. There might be other retreats during Lent the other churches are offering to take advantage of also on that calendar.

Near the end of Lent on Lazarus Saturday, our parish provides a parish-wide cleaning event. Please consider helping with this initiative so we can have a clean church for Pascha. On this day, our second graders will also celebrate their 1st confession.

Holy Week and Pascha! There are no words to express the experience. Maybe you have never attended a Bridegroom Matins service or stayed through the entire night of Pascha. I urge you to consider going and experiencing any of the services of Holy Week. Choose something new. Something different this year.

Faith has to become our own. Maybe we were raised at St Mary's and just take it all for granted. Maybe we are new and just clueless as to what is offered. Let's make an attempt to do more and grow closer to Christ and the church this year. We are blessed to be part of such a holy tradition. May all our spiritual efforts be blessed. I look forward to seeing all of you in the services this year.

Choir Notes

Hello!

Though it is just about as late as it can possibly be, the beginning of Great Lent always seems to elicit the reaction, "oh my goodness, Lent's almost here already?"

Well, yes indeed. At the time of this publication, the time of the Lenten Triodion, the book that provides the hymn for the Pre-Lenten and Lenten seasons, will have begun, and we will be pondering the lessons of the Publican and Pharisee and Prodigal Son. I'm grateful to Dn. Josh Ford for his wonderful sermon on Zacchaeus Sunday, with his look ahead to these stories and how we can better understand them and see ourselves within them.

The beauty of annual cycles, of repetition, is that we are always finding new points of contact, deeper understanding. This is even the beauty of liturgy. The structural texts don't change, the services repeat, there are relatively few variables, and even fewer choices as to what will be included or not, and yet there's seldom a liturgy at which something doesn't speak to me in a new way. We're not the same people from year to year, week to week, or even day to day, and thus we're always unlocking new meaning out of the same texts and hymns and stories.

With that in mind, I'd like to share some of the same texts I offered you last year, hymns that will be heard in the next few weeks, that we might look upon them with eyes and minds that have grown and changed since last year at this time. These hymns stick out as beacons of encouragement as we prepare to enter the season of repentance. In the words of the hymn on Forgiveness Sunday, "Let us begin the fast with joy!"

The Hymns

"The Lenten spring has come, * the flower of repentance. * Brethren, let us cleanse ourselves from all evil, * crying out to the Giver of Light: // 'Glory to Thee, O Lover of Mankind!'" (Tone 3 Sticheron, Aposticha, Cheesefare Wednesday Vespers)

"Let us begin the fast with joy! * Let us prepare ourselves for spiritual efforts! * Let us cleanse our soul and cleanse our flesh! * Let us abstain from every passion as we abstain from food! * Let us rejoice in virtues of the Spirit and fulfill them in love, * that we all may see the Passion of Christ our God, // and rejoice in spirit at the holy Pascha!" (Tone 2 Sticheron at 'Lord, I Call...', Forgiveness Vespers - Maybe it's nostalgia from hearing them all my life on the old Saint Vladimir's Seminary album of Hymns of Pre-sanctified and the Lenten season, but the two above are two of my favorites.)

"Thy grace has shone forth, O Lord: * the grace which illumines our soul. * This is the acceptable time! * This is the time of repentance! * Let us lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light, * that passing through the Fast as through a great sea * we may reach the Resurrection on the third day // of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Savior of our souls." (Tone 4 Idiomelon Sticheron, Aposticha, Forgiveness Vespers.)

"The door of divine repentance has been opened. * Let us enter with fervor, having cleansed our bodies, * observing abstinence from foods and passions in obedience to Christ * Who has called the whole world to His heavenly Kingdom, * offering to the Master of all this tithe of the year, // that we may look with love upon His Holy Resurrection." (Tone 1 Kathisma Hymn, Matins on Monday of Cheese-Week.)

And finally, one of the troparia and the theotokion of Ode 1 of the First Canon (Tone 1) of Matins on Monday of Cheese-Week:

"Today is the joyful forefeast of the time of abstinence, the bright threshold of the Fast. Therefore, brethren, together let us run the race with confident hope and with great eagerness."

"Darkened by the night of transgressions, urgently I flee to you for refuge: for you bore Christ, the Sun of righteousness that shines on those in darkness. O Lady, save me."

Board Resolution

Whereas, St. Mary's Orthodox Cathedral-Orthodox Church in America (hereinafter referred to as St. Mary's), is a religious corporation incorporated under Minn. Stat. 315, and

St. Mary's Orthodox Cathedral-Orthodox Church in America was originally named St. Mary's Russian Orthodox Greek Catholic Church of Minneapolis. On April 10, 1983, a Certificate of Amendment of the Articles of Incorporation was filed as document #4784893 which changed the name of the Church to St. Mary's Orthodox Cathedral-Orthodox Church in America, and

St. Mary's is the owner of a cemetery located at 3025 Stinson Boulevard, Saint Anthony, MN, 55418 previously known as the Saint Mary's Russian Orthodox Greek Catholic Cemetery. This cemetery is a private cemetery as defined by Minn. Stat. 306.87 since it a cemetery established by a religious corporation.

Since June 8, 1912, a total of 89 cemetery plots have been sold which are currently not being used. A list of these plots and their original owners is shown under their Section number, Row number and Plot number. E.g. A-3-31 means Section A, Row 3, and plot 31. To the best of this board's belief, all of the persons named above are deceased, and claims to their plots would belong to their legal heirs.

Under Minn. Stat. 306.21, the owner of a cemetery may, upon resolution of its governing board, require that grantees of lots or parcels, or parties claiming through grantees of lots or parcels, to file with the corporation a written claim of their interest in their lot or parcel, supported by satisfactory evidence of the interest, within 60 days after service of a copy of this resolution.

A copy of this resolution shall be published in the church monthly newsletter, sent via email to all parishioners and shall be published by three weeks published notice in a legal newspaper as authorized by Rule 4.04 of the Minnesota Rules of Civil Procedure. A copy of this resolution shall also be mailed to the last known address of any of the above-named persons. Interested parties shall then have 60 days to respond and assert their rights or provide satisfactory evidence of their interest to the above-named cemetery plots.

Now therefore, be it Resolved, In the event any or all of the above interested parties, or their legal heirs, do not respond and provide satisfactory evidence of their interest to the above-named cemetery plots, then St. Mary's shall be authorized to commence a District Court legal action as authorized by Minn. Stat. §307.11 and §306.22, and Minn. Stat. §559.01, and to seek a court order that states as follows:

That any or all claims of any other parties or any rights of any parties be considered terminated or abandoned and that St. Mary's Orthodox Cathedral, a Minnesota religious corporation, be adjudged and decreed to be the owners and fee simple of said plots as set forth in this resolution, and be free of any claim on the part of any other person to the ownership of any cemetery lots in the cemetery plat dedicated on July 19, 1963, excluding any lots in which persons are buried.

Now therefore, be it Resolved, that the Board of Directors of St. Mary's Orthodox Cathedral-Orthodox Church in America hereby authorizes James Varian, Board President, to act on behalf of St. Mary's to carry out the terms of this resolution.

¹ Minn. Statute 306.21 requires that the church serve a copy of their resolution in the same manner as a complaint in a civil action. In this case service by publication is allowed because Rule 4.04 of the Minnesota Rules of Civil Procedure allows Service by Publication to commence a complaint in a civil action when the subject of the action is real or personal property with the state in or upon which the Defendant has or claims a lien or interest, or the relief demanded consists wholly or partly in excluding the defendant from any such interest or lien.


