## PASTORALLY SPEAKING

Dear Faithful Parishioners and Friends of St. Mary's,

Summer ushers in the warmth we all have been waiting for. The windows open. The grills come out. The gardens begin to grow. Families head to the lake. Kids run around barefoot. Even the evenings seem to slow down a little.

Summer and time with family is a gift. A slower pace, when we can find it, is a blessing from God. However, summer also has a funny way of scattering us. We travel. We get busy. Weekends fill up. Routines disappear. Before we know it, prayer becomes occasional and the life of the parish can feel like something we will "get back to" when fall comes around.

The Holy Spirit is there to remind us that summer filled with its beauty is not the time to let the soul go cold. After the joy of Pascha, the Church leads us to Pentecost, the great feast of the coming of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost reminds us that the Church is not simply an organization, a building, or a calendar of events. The Church is alive because the Holy Spirit is alive in her. The same Spirit who descended upon the apostles is the same Spirit who strengthens us, gathers us, heals us, and sends us into the world.

Another important season that comes right after Pentecost: The Apostles' Fast begins on the Monday after All Saints Sunday and continues until the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul on June 29. It is not meant to be a burden. It is a gentle reminder that the joy of Pentecost is not supposed to remain only in church on a feast day. It is meant to be carried into our homes, our families, our work, our vacations, our tables, and our daily choices.

The apostles received the Holy Spirit, and then they went out, preached, prayed, suffered, served, and gave their lives to Christ and to His Church. The Apostles' Fast reminds us that we are also called to carry Christ into the world faithfully.

It is a wonderful blessing to be able to go to the lake, visit family, sit outside, plant the garden, and rest our bodies and our minds. However, in the lazy days of summer let us be reminded not to let our own souls drift away.

Some ideas of keeping Christ alive in our life can be as easy as visiting another Orthodox parish nearby our vacation hotels/resorts, watching the livestream services while we are at the cabin, read the scripture of the day or Fr. Andrew Jarmus's daily messages that he sends, keeping the fasts as we are able, being diligent to say our prayers, reading and learning more about Orthodoxy, or not to forget the poor and help at Focus Minnesota.

Remember that the life of the Church continues even when our schedules change. The candles still burn. The services are still offered. The sick are still visited. The bills are still paid. The ministries still continue. The parish family still needs the prayers, presence, love, and support of each one of us.

Summer is not the enemy of spiritual life. It can become part of our spiritual life if we receive it with thanksgiving. A meal outside can become prayer. A quiet morning can become stillness with God. A family trip can become a chance to show patience and love.

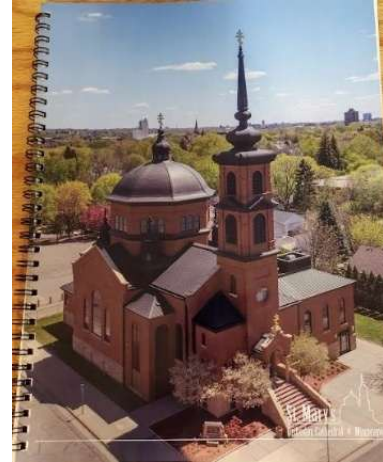
## Grief Group

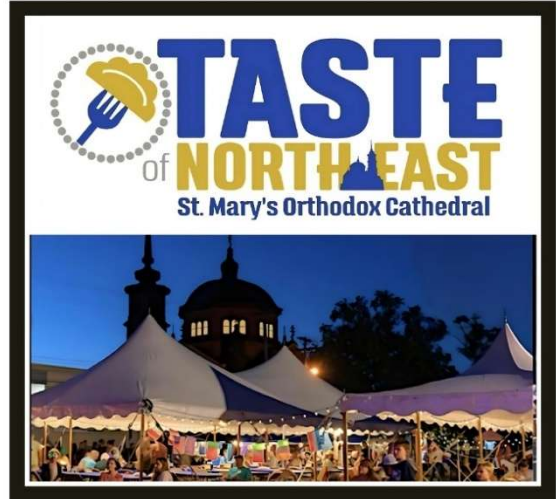
