

Pastoral Reflection

A blessed beginning to November!

The air has turned crisp, the trees have whispered their final hymns of gold, and the year seems to kneel before God in humble silence. We step into this month wrapped in gratitude — for the breath in our lungs, the light in our hearts, and the mercy of God that never ends. The Apostle reminds us, "In everything give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you" (1 Thessalonians 5:18). Thanksgiving isn't just a holiday on the calendar; it's meant to be a condition of the soul. Every act, every word, every breath can become an altar of praise if offered with love.

On November 15, the Nativity Fast begins — forty days that lead us toward the miracle of Bethlehem. The world will be stringing lights and rushing through stores, but the Church will quietly whisper, "Prepare ye the way of the Lord." The fast isn't about deprivation; it's about reorientation/renewed focus. It's about clearing a little manger space in the cluttered inn of our hearts. We simplify not only as a hard asceticism, but to make room for joy. We eat less so we can remember where food comes from and the lack of it to feed all around the world. We speak less so we can listen for the still, small voice of God who teaches us humility. Confession during this time is the soul's deep breath. It's the sweeping of the heart before the Guest arrives. When we empty out the dust and clutter of sin, we make room for grace to move in again. Then, when we come to the Holy Chalice, we are ready to receive the truest Thanksgiving — the Eucharist, the Gift above all gifts. Forget the turkey; this is the feast that feeds eternity. The table of the Lord stretches farther than any dining room, and every soul who hungers for life is welcome.

This year, we will pray the Akathist of Thanksgiving, "Glory to God for All Things," every Wednesday evening throughout the month. We need to learn to see gratitude everywhere, like in the laughter of our children, in the tears we shed, in the bread we break, in the silence between hymns. Then, on Thanksgiving morning, we will gather for the Divine Liturgy, the most powerful act of gratitude the human heart can offer. The Eucharist is heaven's table set among us.

During the Liturgy, we hear the priest proclaim, "Thine own of Thine own we offer unto Thee, on behalf of all and for all." Everything we have is already His, including our lives, our time, our talents, our joys, even our sorrows. And yet, in His love, God allows us to offer them back. We lift up His own gifts, and He fills them with Himself. That is the divine exchange, which is the great mystery of thanksgiving. We offer our smallness, and He gives us His infinity. We offer our bread and wine, and He returns them as His Body and Blood. We offer our hearts, and He fills them with light.

So let this November be more than a change in weather. Let it be a change in spirit and a turning of the heart toward Bethlehem, where Love took flesh for us. Offering what we have, where we are, and as we are. For in the words of the Liturgy itself, we give thanks "on behalf of all, and for all," and God, in His mercy and love for mankind, receives it. Blessed Thanksgiving to all!

Choir Notes

Saints Who Sing By Julia Moricz

In many Orthodox jurisdictions in this country, the month of October is dedicated to Church Musicians. I'm not certain of the origin of this celebration – is it designed to align with the start of a new church liturgical year, is it because it's one of the few months that does not have a major feast day, or is it because several saints recognized as hymnographers and musicians are commemorated during the month of October? Whatever the reason, it is important to honor and celebrate those who enhance the beauty of our worship.

In his 2018 encyclical *Of What Life Do We Speak?*, His Beatitude Metropolitan Tikhon shares his thoughts regarding Orthodox church musicians in America, stating that liturgical music is "often the first thing which deeply strikes people when they walk into an Orthodox church," yet it is "a tool that has become sadly blunted in many of our present-day parishes."

His Beatitude continues by saying, "Unlike other sacred arts, however, music needs constant care and investment in order to come alive. Iconography can be paid for and finished, but the work of musicians in the church is never finished. In this regard, iconography, architecture, furnishings, vestments, all these wonderful arts ultimately serve to show us what the values of a parish were at some point in the past; only music truly reveals what the values of a parish are today."

While October has already passed, I still want to share some information about two Saints who Sing. October 1st being the Feast Day of our parish, we seldom get to hear the beautiful and instructional texts for the commemorations of St. Romanos the Melodist and St. John (Koukouzelis) the Sweet Singer, both of who share their Feast Day with the Protection of the Theotokos.

St. Romanus was born in the fifth century to Jewish parents. After moving to Constantinople, he became a church sacristan in the temple of Hagia Sophia. He was not a talented reader or singer. Once, on the eve of the Nativity of Christ, he read the kathisma verses so poorly that another reader had to take his place. Even the clergy ridiculed him and did not want him assigned to read in church.

On the day of the Nativity of our Lord, while Romanos was praying before an icon of the Theotokos, the Mother of God herself appeared to him in a vision. She gave him a scroll and commanded him to eat it. Upon eating the scroll, the Saint was given the gift of understanding, composition, and hymnography.

That evening at church, St. Romanus sang, in a wondrous voice, his first kontakion, the same kontakion we sing to this day at Christmas. For his zealous service, Romanus was ordained a

deacon and became a teacher of song. Until his death, around the year 556, the hierodeacon Romanus the Melodist composed nearly a thousand hymns, many of which are still used by Orthodox Christians in our liturgical services.

Saint John Koukouzelis, orphaned as a child, was a native of Bulgaria. Endowed with an excellent voice, he entered the Constantinople court school and became a chief court singer, but the opulence and majesty of the imperial court did not appeal to St. John, and he went to Mount Athos where he became a novice and was eventually tonsured a monk.

Possessing deep humility, St. John did not wish to reveal his talent to the brethren in the monastery and happily tended a flock of goats, traveling high into the hilltops. But eventually his talent became known, and John was appointed to sing in the Cathedral on Sundays and Feast Days. Once, while singing an Akathist to the Mother of God, she appeared to the Saint and encouraged him to continue singing. Like St. Romanos, St. John composed and arranged many church hymns, including numerous troparia and kontakia.

While many people think Koukouzelis is a Greek word for music or even St. John's last name, it simply means "beans and peas" as a reminder of the humility and ascetical discipline of St. John the Sweet Singer.

O Romanus, our father . . . for, composing angelic songs, thou hast shown thy life to be divine.

Entreat Christ God that He may deliver from dangers and tribulations those who sing praises to thee!





Georgia Pilgrimage - 2026

Fr. Andrew Morbey is arranging for a pilgrimage or two to Georgia in 2026. Building Attendant

St. Mary's Orthodox Cathedral in NE Minneapolis is currently taking applications for Building Attendants. Responsibilities include opening and closing the building, monitoring entry/departure of visitors, event set-up & tear-down, trash disposal, and occasional light cleaning & maintenance duties (spills, restocking bathrooms, sidewalk salting).

Requires reliability to be on time; ability to follow instructions and procedures; CRP certification or ability to complete training; lifting ability of 30 lbs. The hourly rate is \$15.97. Hours are part-time and vary. Primary hours needed are evenings, Saturdays, and Sundays. The number of hours a month can vary from 5 to 20, depending on scheduled activities.
