Pastoral Reflection

In our Christian journey, it's important to immerse ourselves in the routines of our faith. We diligently attend church services, set aside time for prayer, participate in fasting, and engage in various spiritual disciplines. But amidst all these activities, we can sometimes lose sight of the fundamental reason behind our devotion: our love for God and our desire to experience His love more deeply. As the Holy Apostle John reminds us, "We love because He first loved us" (1 John 4:19).

Too often, we fall into the trap of treating our faith like a checklist. We tick off boxes for each prayer said, each scripture read, and each service attended. While these practices are valuable, they were never meant to be the end goal. They are merely pathways that lead us to a more profound connection with our Creator. The essence of Christianity isn't about fulfilling obligations or engaging in a transactional relationship with God. At its core, our faith is about love—a deep, transformative love that flows both ways between us and our Heavenly Father. As Christ Himself taught: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment" (Matthew 22:37–38).

Centering our faith on experiencing God's love allows us to heal and mature spiritually. As we open ourselves to His love, we become more capable of extending that love to others. Our relationships improve, our perspective on life's challenges shifts, and we find ourselves becoming more aligned with God's purpose for our lives. It's important to remember that this journey of experiencing God's love is ongoing. It's not a destination we're going to reach and then stop. As St. Paul teaches, "The love of Christ compels us" (2 Corinthians 5:14), drawing us constantly deeper into communion with Him.

The reason we should keep showing up in our faith journey is both simple and profound: we love God, and we want to experience His love in ever-deeper ways in our lives. This love is the foundation, the motivation, and the ultimate reward of our Christian walk. As we embrace this truth, we'll discover a faith that is vibrant, meaningful, and truly transformative in every aspect of our lives.

Choir Notes

(Someday) Saints Who Sing Over the past few months in this column I have been sharing the lives of saints who are recognized by the Orthodox Church as hymnographers and musicians, and there are several more that we will highlight over the next few months.

But today I want to take a slightly different approach. In July I was blessed to spend a week serving at St Mary's Summer Camp. It was my 6th time at this camp, although I have spent countless weeks over the past 50 years at Orthodox Church Camps throughout the US. One of my main duties at St Mary's Camp is leading the singing at our liturgical services. We have camp style Matins and Vespers each day and also serve the Divine Liturgy on Sunday and Thursday mornings. The music and readings for all of these services are sung by the campers themselves, with support from our counselors and administrative staff. But each day the Epistle, Synaxarion, and various verses to responsorial psalms are intoned by the campers themselves. Imagine over 320 people uniting their voices to praise God. To participate in the services at camp is truly a joyous and uplifting experience.

We also sing hymns as people enter and leave chapel to keep our minds focused on Christ and the beauty of our hymnology. Many counselors & parents share with me, both during and after camp, that the young people in their care often sing the hymns from camp at other times of the year.

These young people, each made in the image & Dikeness of God, are indeed called to sainthood and with a continued focus could someday become Saints Who Sing.

The music at camp is a mixture of both Byzantine style hymns, with a single melodic line, as well as 4-part harmony that is more common to the tradition here at St Mary's Cathedral. And our Camp Service Book references some names that may be familiar to you — Bishop Basil (Essey) from the Antiochian Archdiocese and our own beloved former choir director Resa Ellison, who sadly passed away while serving our community. Two more individuals who could someday be recognized as Saints Who Sing.

But our own cathedral choir has a vast library of music which is sung during Liturgy and other services and many of these selections were arranged by people you know. People who have also dedicated their lives to the hymnology of our faith. Have you noticed the new Vouchsafe O Lord the choir has been singing – that was written by our own David Lucs who grew up in this parish and returned to the Twin Cities to bless us with his talent. Does the name Wesche ring a bell to anyone? Both Mark (our current talented choir director) & amp; his brother Sean have arranged hymns which our choir sings both on Sundays and in concerts. There is a version of the

Saturday evening prokeimenon from Vespers that we often sing which was arranged by Fr Paul Jannakos. Many of you probably remember when Fr Paul served our parish and his son, daughter-in-law, and grandchildren are active members of the Cathedral. Zach Mandell has worked his magic on some of the selections you hear throughout the year. And, of course, Fr Gregory Ealy's name appears on several selections in the choir binders. All talented individuals and all someday Saints of our Faith.

So next time you are in church just think that the hymn you are hearing was arranged by someone who someday could be glorified as a Saint Who Sings.
